



Letter for Schools Outlining Presentation

To Whom It May Concern;

Thank you for your interest in The Asservo Project and what we do to combat Human Trafficking and Child Exploitation. Education is where this fight starts. In our youth presentation, your students will learn how predators exploit vulnerabilities and lure them into human trafficking (modern day slavery). They will learn useful tools to help protect themselves and their friends from becoming exploited by predators both in person and online. Our students and children are at risk, as the majority of exploitation and trafficking occurs online. They will also learn what to do should they find themselves, or a friend, in a potential grooming or trafficking situation. We will let them know there is a way out and the steps to take.

Types of Content

Our presentation includes definitions and examples of Human Trafficking, child sex trafficking, abuse, exploitation, and sextortion. We use short relevant videos containing true stories of teen survivors who chose to tell their stories in hopes of helping others.

Topics Covered

- Types of Human Trafficking
- How to recognize the signs
- What makes you vulnerable
- How predators target their victims
- Recognizing dangerous situations
- Sex-trafficking, sexting and sextortion

- A way out; people are here to help

Target Audience

The program is designed for 6th through 12th grade students and lasts about 45 minutes. We require the full program be viewed with the school administrators prior to The Asservo Project presenting it to the students, so that it can be approved by the school administrators. We advise the teachers and administration receive the presentation before we educate the students. We want the teachers and administration to hear our presentation and ask any relevant questions so that they feel prepared and equipped when we present to the students. The teacher/admin program is also about 45 minutes long.

Please note, we are requesting a \$250 honorarium per each day of travel to have us come speak at your schools and educate your students. This helps cover our presenter's time, travel, and cost of materials. If this is an issue, please reach out and we can discuss this.
